

Here's a happy polka for the holiday season! Jimmy Doyle's was recorded by Jimmy Doyle & Dan O'Leary on their album *Traditional Music from the Kingdom of Kerry* and listed as 'Doyle's favorite'. The tune was recommended by CIM Instructor Charlie Heymann, and appears on his album with Ann Heymann (the duo is known as Cláirseach) named *Ann's Harp* which came out on vinyl in 1981. Other notable recordings include Pádraig O'Keefe's *Sliabh Luachra Fiddle Master* (with Denis Murphy).

The IAM/IMDA Honors evenings are a cherished tradition, celebrating special people who help “keep the fires burning” for Irish music and culture. The November 21st event, honoring IAM Honorees Elaine Murray and Ed Koehne and the Green Fire Irish Dancers, perfectly embodied this spirit.

The evening began at the Celtic Junction Arts Center with social time, where guests warmly greeted Elaine and Ed.

The program commenced with bagpiper IAM Grant Recipient Michael Breidenbach leading a procession featuring Elaine, Ed, and the Green Fire Dancers. The Mistress of Ceremonies then presented a Proclamation officially declaring November 21st Green Fire Irish Dancers Day in St. Paul.

The Green Fire Dancers performed historic dances in period costume and delighted the audience with their popular Broom Dance and a hard shoe piece.

The event also raised funds for IAM’s Educational Grant Program. Guests enjoyed music from IAM Educational Grant recipient Teddy Brandt and friends with Pick, Buttons and Bow.



It seemed especially fitting to honor the Green Fire Dancers by inviting everyone to dance. The night was full of personal connections, featuring IAM Honoree Tom Dahill and Green Fire Alum Ginny Johnson with IAM Grant Recipient Ryan Behnke providing the music and Green Fire Alum Paul McCluskey calling the dances. (Thanks to Tom Juenemann for joining the band!) Elaine and Ed danced nearly every piece, with the evening concluding with Elaine’s favorite ceili dance—the Acadian version of Strip the Willow.

It was an emotional evening for Elaine and Ed, with a number of former Green Fire dancers in attendance. The dancers happily offered greetings and flowers to their founders. Elaine and Ed enjoyed a long-distance greeting from Katie Griffin of Ireland. Katie expressed her thanks to the teachers, wishing them well and acknowledging their contributions as a “living legacy of your dedication, your heart and your respect for the tradition.”

An Leabhragán The Bookcase



Dear Readers,

We've had some terrific books of Irish interest to read over the past year. Here's a recap of five of my favorites, in case you feel like giving a book to a Hibernophile this holiday season!

Rule Of the Land by Garrett Carr (Faber & Faber)

The well-respected novelist Garrett Carr walked the border between Northern Ireland and the Republic a few years ago and wrote a remarkable book: part travelogue, part history, part philosophy, and all wonderful. If you're a nature lover, hiker, or appreciator of stories told by travelers of strangers they meet along the way, this book will suit you, either for yourself or as a gift.

This Is Happiness by Niall Williams (Bloomsbury Publishing)

I'd put this novel in my Top Five Fiction category. Set in a little town of Faha in the 1950s when the most remote parts of Ireland were finally getting electricity, it deals with the stuff of memory, magic, and what makes a group of adjacent souls a community. The brightest light that shines in Faha is the glow of kindred spirits together.

The O'Brien Book of Irish Fairy Tales and Legends Una Leary (O'Brien Books)

This beautifully illustrated book of ten classic Irish folk tales will delight children of any age who love old tales and a bit of magic. Lyrical and full of delight!

The Library at the Edge of the World by Felicity Hayes-McCoy (Harper Perennial)

Another of my favorite novels, one I love to give as a gift because I haven't found anyone yet who doesn't appreciate it. When Hanna Casey returns to her little Irish town after her marriage falls apart, she takes a job in the town library and starts to rebuild her life, makes friends and tries to save the neglected, down on its luck library from closing. The Finfarran Peninsula is a thinly-disguised Dingle Peninsula and is full of local references of Dingle, for anyone who loves the town or has just visited for a few days. Pluck, luck and beautiful scenery abound in this one!

The Companion to Irish Traditional Music, third edition, edited by Fintan Vallely (Cork University Press) is an impressive encyclopedia covering the wide span of Irish traditional music and song. It covers the history, decline and then revival and current development of Irish trad music, with over 200 experts in the field weighing in on this vast topic. It is an indispensable reference for any lover of Irish music, and an admirable reference book for any library.

That's it for this month! Just five books from the hundreds I could mention. May your holidays be full of warmth, cheer, music and conviviality—and a little downtime for quiet reading, too. See you in the New Year!

The above was sung by Mr. Sydney Boutilier of French Village, Nova Scotia for Helen Creighton's recording machine in 1950. Creighton called it a "very pretty little love song" but, as far as I can tell, did not publish it in any of her folk song collections. It seems to be a rare song in tradition but I agree with Creighton that the melody is nice! I found this one among the many gems now available online through the Nova Scotia Archives at archives.novascotia.ca.

Northwoods Songs features a new song each month pulled from my research into old songs collected in the pine woods region that stretches from New Brunswick west through northern Minnesota. In the 1800s, a vibrant culture of singing and song-making developed in lumber camp bunkhouses and on Great Lakes ships. The repertoire and singing style were greatly influenced by Irish folk repertoire and singing styles. Many singers in the region had Irish background themselves.

Each installment of *Northwoods Songs* is also published online at www.evergreentrad.com. My hope is that others will learn some of these songs and make them their own as I have.

Céilí Corner by Bhloscaidh O’Keane
